In 2023 we welcome all new participants to the Children's Book Council of Australia's (CBCA) **Sun Project's Shadow Judging: Book of the Year Awards.**

Our Shadow Judging program was trialled in 2020 and 2021 in Victoria. In 2022 we seeded the program nationally with an Australian Federal RiSE grant— 141 groups across Australia have helped crystalise our process and resources—including a dedicated website.

Australian children's literature plays a unique role in our culture. It has the power to **shine a light on our world**, speaking directly to young people.

The **Shadow Judging: Book of the Year** program is an important component of our Sun Project suite—connecting young people to great literature.

In 2023 our **NEW Illuminating: Australian Children's Literature** is a series of 4 lectures and 4 workshops in an online course developed in partnership with the University of Sydney. The program is presented by Professor Alyson Simpson and open to anyone interested in unpacking what makes great Australian Children's Literature. It is a useful partner program for Shadow Judging mentors and facilitators, indeed anyone interested in using talk to delve deeply into quality literature.

We are inviting young voices from across Australia to join the conversation about the books on our 2023 Book of the Year Shortlist. At the end of Children's Book Week, at our Shadower's Choice Awards August 25, winners, chosen by our young groups of judges, will be announced.

Children's Book Week—since 1945—has been an opportunity to celebrate reading for pleasure, the Shadow Judging program presents young people with an opportunity to have their opinions heard and creatively respond to the CBCA Book of the Year Shortlist.





BY CONNECTING KIDS, BOOKS + CREATIVES, WHILE STRENGTHENING YOUNG VOICES, OUR PARTICIPANTS WILL:

build personal aesthetic literary appreciation and they will be immersed in the language that describes literary techniques

1 Form a group with an adult facilitator: this meets onsite within a participating organisation (in an early childhood centre, community group, public library, primary school, high school) which will provide the space, resources and guidance for the groups of young people

2 REGISTER @ <u>shadowjudging.cbca.org.au</u> your group for a fee of <u>\$50.00</u> to access the website and resources and cover administrative and support costs.

3 CHOOSE ONE SHORTLIST CATEGORY OF SIX BOOKS FROM OUR 2023 CBCA BOOK OF THE YEAR SHORTLIST (Announced and online on **March 28** @ **noon**). Gather or purchase books.

4 Meet regularly as a group and **READ**, **SHARE**, **DISCUSS**, **DEBATE** the six books in your chosen category.

5 OPTIONAL: In 2020, 2021, and 2022 our groups and our creatives (writers

Shadow Judges use the same judging criteria as our Book of the Year Awards Judges to choose their winner. This process is supported with resources available to groups on our program website. The resources unpack the criteria for each category. There is no one explicit way for facilitators to assist the process, the important goal is for the group to talk through the criteria and respond creatively to the literature.

For teachers: By participating in the Shadow Judging program you are encompassing the content of the Australian Curriculum: English Literature strand.

Literature: understanding, appreciating, responding to, analysing and creating literary texts

and illustrators) confirmed the mutally beneficial opportunity to share and identify in works the literary techniques included in the criteria. Groups are encouraged at this point to **INVITE A CREATIVE TO A GROUP SESSION**. Facilitators can approach local bookshops, speaking agencies or their state CBCA Branch Mentor to discuss the options and cost of having a creative present to their group. (State Mentors: Are co-ordinated by each CBCA Branch. They will be assigned by Branches to support Group Facilitators with information and strategies for eliciting responses to literature from young voices.)

6 Share your group's **CREATIVE RESPONSES TO THE BOOKS**. A critical and popular component of the program is an opportunity to share on the Shadow Judging website a creative response to the books read by those participating (other groups and the public can view these responses). Feedback from previous young Shadow Judges identify this as a positive experience because it allows them to activate their own creativity. Examples have included; writing new endings, book trailers, posters, videos, recorded debates, and designing alternative book covers. The options are endless.

7 VOTE collaboratively to nominate a winner in their category. By August 14 (deadline), groups will be voting for their winners. The CBCA will collate votes and announce online the SHADOWERS' CHOICE AWARDS ON AUGUST 25, 2023. Groups come together for a final celebration, receive their Shadow Judging certificates and learn of the winning choices.

In 2023 the CBCA the Shadow Judging: Book of the Year Awards has limited funding support for groups. We are however immensely grateful to the Copyright Agency: Cultural Fund for support for a small number of groups (30 nationally) through our State CBCA branches.

There will also be limited opportunities to support some groups with books through discretionary CBCA state branch budgets.
